- Worked in Liverpool, North Wales, Merton, Sutton, Medway and Kent
- I always wanted to know what was behind the behaviour
- At LBS we did a deep dive in 2002 across agencies
- Top causes of children on CP plans, Excluded from School, metal health issues
- DA (then DV) / Trauma, Unresolved Loss and Grief, Parenting





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Executive Principal / CEO Alternative learning Trust

- I led the LA Behaviour Support Team for schools
- We worked as a multi-agency network to commission DA training
- We looked for the only training available for supporting children who had experienced DA / VAWaG
- Trainers came from Canada to train us - 'Group Treatment Program' for children to be run alongside, Group





treatment for women.

- So started my journey of what helps children, who have experienced DA / VAWaG at every age and stage. Both boys and Girls.
- How does diversity play out gender, ethnicity, disability, socioeconomics
- So here I am today

Support From A Family Outreach Worker

All students receive support from a Family Outreach Worker, which includes:

- Daily 1:1 check-ins
- 1:1 sessions, providing mentoring and targeted work
- Regular communication with parents & carers
- Half-termly TAC (Team Around the Child) meetings
- Regular communication with external professionals and attendance to meetings
- Advocation for young people at meetings





BAM (Becoming A Man)

BAM (Becoming A Man) is a five-week programme of support offered to boys, which covers the following topics:

- Relationships & Sexual Health
- Identity, Sexuality & Online Safety
- Mental Health
- Community & Crime
- Being A Successful Man

Violet Group

Violet is a six-week programme offered to girls, covering:

- Self-Esteem
- Mental Health
- Domestic Abuse
- Criminal & Sexual Exploitation
- Healthy Relationships
- Sexual Health

Primary & Secondary Turnaround Programme

The Turnaround Programme is a preventative project which runs for five weeks, supporting students from external primary and secondary schools who are at risk of permanent exclusion. Students learn to recognise the impact their current behaviour is having on their future and are provided with sessions to enhance their learning and promote positive well-being. Topics include

- Healthy Living, Sexual Health & Relationships
- Knife Crime, County Lines and Gang Involvement
- Online Safety, Anti-Social Behaviour & The Law
- Drugs & Alcohol

CEOP (Child Exploitation & Online Protection)

The School's CEOP Ambassador provides advice for students, parents/carers and professionals. In addition, 1:1 sessions and workshops are delivered, promoting online safety and raising awareness around online threats. Topics covered include:

- Social Media
- Naked Pictures & Sexting
- Cyberbullying
- Reporting, Identity Checking & Grooming
- Sextortion





Bridging The Gap Programme

This is a six-week parenting course covering topics such as:

- Improving Communication
- Understanding Behaviour
- Boosting Young People's Self-Esteem
- Effectively Managing Behaviour
- Parenting Styles

The intervention also gives parents and carers an opportunity to meet with other parents and carers and helps them to feel less isolated.

RAE Programme

RAE is ten-week recovery group work programme for children who have been exposed to domestic violence and abuse. Referrals are accepted from students who attend a Sutton School or who reside in the London Borough of Sutton.

Family Groups (For Parents & Carers)

Virtual and face-to-face groups are arranged for parents and carers to attend, giving them the opportunity to seek advice and guidance from the facilitators and meet other parents to exchange experiences and share tips.

A number of different topics are covered within the sessions and are tailored around the needs of the parents/carers along with current issues.

Sessions are facilitated for parents and carers of primary and secondary students, and offer a great opportunity for parents and carers to network with other adults.

Self-Esteem Programme

This is a six week programme which runs for women in the community (aged 16+) which supports women to explore and develop their confidence and self-esteem, with a focus on the future.


